Failure to follow these procedures will be perceived as cheating:

CONSEQUENCES

CLASS WORK/HOMEWORK

Students are expected to actively participate in ALL class work, homework, projects, and tests. **I have high expectations!** ALL of your work should show that you are doing the BEST that you can do!!!

If a test is scheduled for the following week, students are encouraged to look over the material during the weekend.

GRADING

All work will be reviewed and graded in some manner. Our focus is placed on depth of knowledge and the ability of students to show what they know. Classwork and homework (formative) will count for 40% of the final grade and Projects/Tests/Quizzes (summative) will count as 60% of the final grade.
